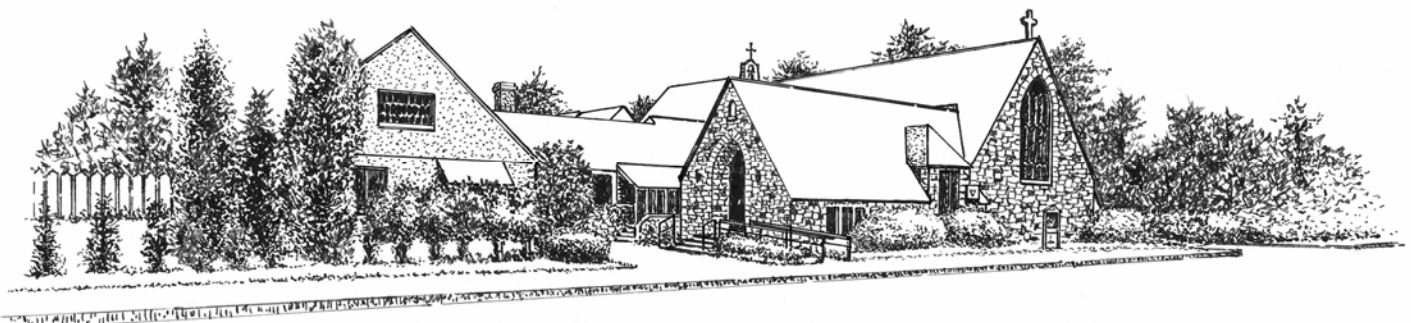

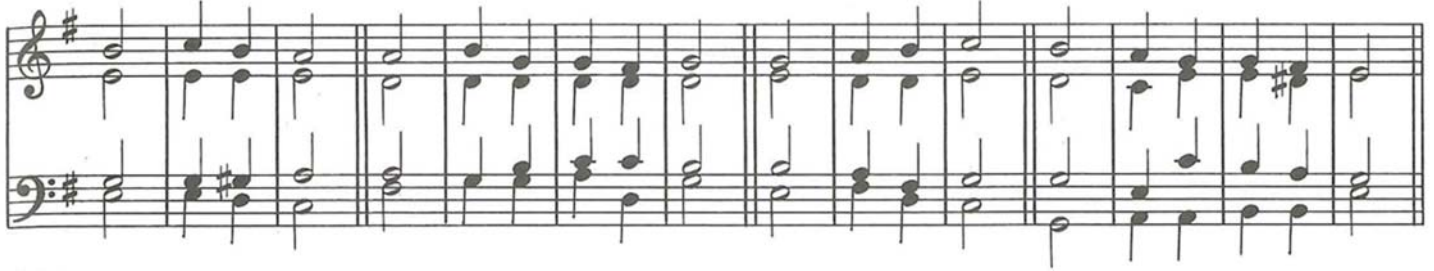
As for me, Daniel, my spirit was troubled within me, and the visions of my

Second Lesson: Ephesians 1:11-23

In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as

you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

As our minds turn towards the Thanksgiving holiday, the St. Andrew's outreach committee invites you to show your thanksgiving in a practical way—putting your faith into action—by supporting two of the parish's major outreach partners who help local people in need: the Wellesley Food Pantry and Health Care Without Walls.

One way you can help is by purchasing men's white athletic socks, size L or XL which will be given to homeless people with diabetes by Health Care Without Walls. Another way you can help is to purchase much needed items for the Wellesley Food Pantry. They have provided us with a short list of

much needed items: coffee, sardines, beef stew, vegetable oil, canned salmon, and canned pineapple, as well as laundry detergent, diapers, and feminine care items (not food, but these items can't be purchased with food stamps and are always in demand).

During the month of November, we ask you to show your thanksgiving by purchasing these items and bringing them to the church on Sunday. There will be two special baskets at the back of the church where your gifts can be left—one marked "Sox Box" and the other "Wellesley Food Pantry." Every Sunday during November, we will have a special prayer of thanks at the offertory for the gifts that have been brought.

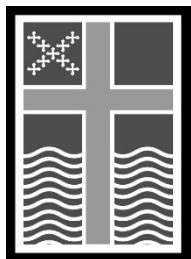
