Christmas Services

Christmas Eve In-person Services

Friday, December 24, our in-person services will be at 3pm, 5pm, and 10pm. COVID safety protocols will limit attendance at each service to 350 people, on a first come, first served basis. If you want to attend the 5pm service, we suggest you arrive early. We encourage some of you to attend the 3pm or 10pm service instead

Children's Service at 3pm

This half-hour service is designed for young children and families to experience the Christmas story through music and movement (no Holy Communion).

Family Eucharist at 5pm

This is an hour-long service with carols, communion, and a sermon. This service ends with the church lights darkened and everyone holding a candle as we sing *Silent Night*. This is the most popular service.

Choral Service at 10pm

This is a beautiful hour-long service with communion, carols, choir anthems, and a sermon, preceded by a string quartet prelude at 9:40pm. The service ends with the church lights darkened and everyone holding a candle as we sing *Silent Night*.

Christmas Eve Online Services

We will be streaming the 3pm and the 5pm, also available to view later.

Christmas Day

On Saturday, December 25, at 10am there will be an in-person service of Holy Communion with carols. This is a rather relaxed and happy service with about 50 to 60 people. Coming to this Christmas service in person would avoid a crowd.

Sunday December 26

On Sunday, December 26 there will be no in-person services at St. Andrew's. Instead, at 10am there will be a live Zoom-style service online with readings, carols, prayers, and a homily. This will be broadcast from the homes of the clergy in the same way we did during the pandemic. This service will be available later online as well.

Sacred Ground Sign up now!

Please email Adrian, if you would like to participate in the monthly 10 session Sacred Ground course beginning in January 2022. The Sacred Ground course was developed by the Episcopal Church to explore issues of racial justice and living into Christ's vision for us to be the Beloved Community. The Sacred Ground course is being widely used throughout the Episcopal Church and involves ten once a month sessions which include a mix of film, reading, and discussion. The kick-off date, Saturday January 22, will be a longer session from 9am to 1pm. The rest of the sessions will be two hours each. The dates planned for the course so far are: Saturday, January 22 (Launch date) 9am to 1pm, Wednesday, February 16, 7 to 9pm, Saturday, March 19, 9 to 11am, Wednesday, April 27, 7 to 9pm. You will be able to partic-

ipate either online or in person.

- Online: If paying by credit card, please process your request by Monday,
 December 27. If paying by ACH, process by Tuesday, December 28. Payments submitted online can take 48 hours to be received and may not be credited until Monday, January 3, 2022. Please allow enough time if you need your payment to be credited on your 2021 statement.
- In-person: Drop at the church office by noon on Thursday, December 30 (the door will be unlocked from 8am to noon Tuesday December 27 through Thursday December 30).
