## Phishing and Spoofing Attempts

Email phishing is the act of impersonating a business or other entity for the purpose of tricking the recipient of email into giving up sensitive personal information. Spoofing uses deception to trick users into providing sensitive information. Display name spoofing is a type of email spoofing, in which only the email sender's display name is forged. Somebody can do this by registering a new Gmail account with the same name as the contact they want to impersonate. This is what keeps happening with Adrian's name. In most cases, if you hover your cursor over his name you will see the email address is not his "standrewswellesley.org" address and you can safely block that sender. Please google how to block senders according to what email client provider you use (macmail, gmail, verizon, or outlook, etc.).
