Icon of the Week

The Rt. Rev. Barbara C. Harris

June 12, 1930-March 13, 2020

Barbara Clementine Harris was born in Philadelphia, the middle child of three. Most influential in her life were the women in her family, her mother, her maternal grandmother, and her maternal great-grandmother, who had been born into slavery in Maryland in 1857 and who lived in the household until her death in 1938. Harris was active in the civil rights movement traveling in 1965 to Greenville, Mississippi to help register Black voters. She also took part in the Selma to Montgomery march.

Barbara Harris worked for a national public relations firm before being ordained at the age of 50. During that time, she had an active lay ministry in the Episcopal Church in Christian education and prison chaplaincy. She also held leadership roles at parish, diocesan, and churchwide levels before discerning a call to ordained ministry. She was ordained a priest in 1980, just four years after the ordination of women was recognized. Harris served as a parish priest and a prison chaplain, while also consulting for corporations on public policy and social issues. In 1984, she was named executive director of the Episcopal Church Publishing Company and publisher of the social justice magazine *The Witness*.

On February 11, 1989, before a congregation of 8,000 at the Hynes Convention Center, Boston, while the whole world watched via live television, Harris became the first woman ordained as a bishop in the Anglican Communion. It was the climax of months of controversy and a media maelstrom that followed her election. She preached and worked continually for the eradication of racism, sexism, and homophobia. Her work has been helping the church bring about the full inclusion of all people in the life and sacraments of the church.

Her feast day is March 13.

The Holy Spirit behind you is greater than any obstacle ahead of you. Bishop Barbara Harris always kept a slip of paper with this mantra with her.
