If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

Icon of the Week

Holy Trinity

From a story in the book of Genesis called *The hospitality of Abraham*, Abraham meets three men later discovered to be angels. Based on Russian iconographer Andrei Rublev's famous icon of the Holy Trinity painted in 1411, this icon depicts the unity of the Godhead—God in three persons—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, which was the first time the Godhead was depicted as three persons.

These angels create a circle inviting us into the center. The angels are depicted talking. The gestures are smooth and restrained, demonstrating the sublime nature of their conversation. The left angel symbolizes God the Father. His right hand is in the gesture for the *exordium* (saying something important). The central angel represents Christ. The red and gold stole draped over this figures' right shoulder is modeled after that worn by the sons of the Byzantine emperors indicating royalty; here it indicates Christ's divine Sonship. The right angle represents the Holy Spirit. The blue color of the Holy Spirit's robe symbolizes divinity, the green color represents new life.

The wings of two angels, the Father and the Son overlap. The blue color of the Son's robe symbolizes divinity, the brown color represents earth—his humanity—and the gold speaks of kingship of God. The wings of the Holy Spirit do not touch the Son's wings, they are imperceptibly divided by the Son's spear. The poses and the inclinations of the Holy Spirit and the Son's heads demonstrate their submission to the Father, yet their placement on the thrones at the same level symbolizes equality. The tree symbolizes the Tree of Life and serves as a reminder of Jesus's death on the cross and his subsequent resurrection, which opened the way to eternal life. Finally, the mountain is a symbol of the spiritual ascent, which mankind accomplishes with the help of the Holy Spirit.

The unity of the Trinity's underlying reality expresses unity and love between all things: That they may all be one just as you, father, or in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. —John 17: 21
